****READ GENERAL RULES for delivery dates & times!!****

The Greenery represents Floriculture and Horticulture, the production or display of plant stock, flowers or foliage. In this Department, your green thumb is required. The flowers in this category are the home grown variety. A few green thumb hints are as follows:

1. Pick your specimens in the cool of the morning or evening before delivering your exhibit.
2. Take a pail of tepid water to the garden and immediately place your selected flowers in it. Set the flower pail in a cool dark place away from drafts or heat for a few hours. This conditions the blooms for showing.
3. Make sure your exhibit is fresh, clean and crisp, including foliage. While most entries are required to have foliage attached, leaves under the container's waterline should be removed.
4. Attach a tag with both the flower's correct scientific and variety names and attach to the plant. This helps educate other exhibitors and visitors who wish to grow the plant.

The "Greenery" is located in the glass foyer of the Community Arts Building providing an inviting and attractive entrance for the visitors of the Community Arts Exhibit Hall. The Greenery will provide a sunny environment for the plant and floral exhibits.

Please read the following stipulations for this category and carefully follow all rules. Judging will be based on adherence to these rules.

NOTE: A winning ribbon is required from this Department to compete for exhibitor of the year.

1. **Department IV** is included in the ten (10) entries per exhibitor, one (1) per class for the \$12.00 fee. Entry forms must be postmarked no later than August 1.
2. **Delivery of exhibits**
Fresh arrangements or live plants that need an exceptional amount of TLC must be delivered no sooner than 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 20. Other plants or Department IV exhibits may be entered on regular dropoff entry days. At the time of judging, if the quality of the exhibit is too poor to warrant judging or is questionable to the life span of the plant for the duration of the display, you will be asked to remove your item.
3. **Quality of Flowers**
The quality of the flower is the main requisite in preparing and entering flowers for showing purpose. Quantity may be the cause of rejection. In selecting flowers, be sure that you cut the best that your garden has to offer. **A few, well displayed flowers, with long stems,** will emphasize the individual beauty of each flower.
4. **Watering**
Make sure that your exhibit is suitably watered when delivered. You will be given one additional pass to come in during the fair to freshen your arrangement or plants ONLY if requested at exhibit drop-off.

- 1) Table centerpiece must comply to a 36” round table. Table will be skirted in white and a clean, pressed tablecloth is recommended to enhance your design.
- 2) Table must be set up on Wednesday, August 20, 2008 from 9:00am - 1:00 pm. Take down will be allowed at the completion of the Fair (see General Rules for exhibit pickup dates/times).

THEME: “Seasonal Splendor”. Decorate your “table for two” keeping with the theme “Seasonal Splendor”. The Season you choose to represent is up to you -- perhaps sunflowers for the summer? How about fall foliage for the autumn? Maybe the winter season, or the Christmas season, is your favorite? Be creative in creating your attractive and functional decorated table.

JUDGING: Exhibits will be judged on attractiveness and creativity. No fresh fruits or vegetables are allowed.

Table setting will be judged on functional design and color, centerpiece arrangement, creative expression, textural relationship, and suitability to occasion.

If you are using actual place settings and silver for judging, plan on removing for displaying time or replace it with something that you wouldn’t be too concerned about.
