2 **EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL**

3 A bill to make appropriations for the department of state
4 police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending
5 September 30, 2009; to provide for the expenditure of those
6 appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the
7 consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of
8 other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for
9 certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties
10 of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain
11 employees.

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

10 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
11 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources
12 under part 1 for fiscal year 2008-2009 is \$399,671,100.00 and state
13 spending from state resources to be paid to local units of
14 government for fiscal year 2008-2009 is \$20,541,400.00. The
15 itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which
16 spending to local units of government will occur:

3 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this bill are
4 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
5 to 18.1594.

6 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:

7 (a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification
8 system.

9 (b) "Department" means the department of state police.

10 (c) "DHS" means the United States department of homeland
11 security.

12 (d) "Director" means the director of the department of state
13 police.

14 (e) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.

15 (f) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

16 (g) "DOT" means the United States department of
17 transportation.

18 (h) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.

19 (i) "FTE" means full-time equated.

20 (j) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

21 (k) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

22 (l) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.

23 (m) "MCOLES" means the Michigan commission on law enforcement
24 standards.

25 (n) "MDCH" means the Michigan department of community health.

1 (o) "MDMB" means the Michigan department of management and
2 budget.

3 (p) "MDOC" means the Michigan department of corrections.

4 (q) "MDOS" means the Michigan department of state.

5 (r) "MDOT" means the Michigan department of transportation.

6 (s) "MDTR" means the Michigan department of treasury.

7 (t) "MPSCS" means the Michigan public safety communications
8 system.

9 Sec. 204. The civil service commission shall bill departments
10 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1%
11 charge authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state
12 constitution of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount
13 of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.

14 Sec. 205. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state
15 classified civil service. State departments and agencies are
16 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil
17 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state
18 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not
19 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from 1 position
20 to another within a department.

21 (2) The state budget director may grant exceptions to this
22 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the
23 hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency
24 unable to deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the
25 state, result in the inability of the state to receive federal

1 funds, or necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any
2 savings from maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director shall
3 report quarterly to the chairpersons of the senate and house of
4 representatives standing committees on appropriations the number of
5 exceptions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous
6 quarter and the reasons to justify the exception.

7 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
8 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for
9 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
10 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
11 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
12 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

13 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
14 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state
15 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
16 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
17 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
18 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

19 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
20 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local
21 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
22 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
23 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
24 MCL 18.1393.

1 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
2 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private
3 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
4 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
5 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
6 MCL 18.1393.

7 Sec. 208. The department shall use the Internet to fulfill the
8 reporting requirements of this bill. This requirement may include
9 transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
10 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include
11 placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

12 Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for
13 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
14 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
15 services, or both, are available. Preference shall be given to
16 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
17 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable
18 quality. In addition, preference shall be given to goods or
19 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan
20 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are
21 competitively priced and of comparable quality.

22 Sec. 210. The director shall take all reasonable steps to
23 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for
24 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The
25 director shall strongly encourage firms with which the department

1 contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and
2 deprived communities for services, supplies, or both.

3 Sec. 218. Funds appropriated in part 1 for at-post troopers
4 shall only be expended for trooper salaries, wages, benefits,
5 retirement, equipment, supplies, and other expenses directly
6 related to state troopers assigned to general law enforcement
7 duties at a department post, detachment, satellite office, or a
8 resident trooper function.

9 Sec. 223. (1) Due to the current budgetary problems in this
10 state, out-of-state travel for the fiscal year ending September 30,
11 2009 shall be limited to situations in which 1 or more of the
12 following conditions apply:

13 (a) The travel is required by legal mandate or court order or
14 for law enforcement purposes.

15 (b) The travel is necessary to protect the health or safety of
16 Michigan citizens or visitors or to assist other states in similar
17 circumstances.

18 (c) The travel is necessary to produce budgetary savings or to
19 increase state revenues, including protecting existing federal
20 funds or securing additional federal funds.

21 (d) The travel is necessary to comply with federal
22 requirements.

23 (e) The travel is necessary to secure specialized training for
24 staff that is not available within this state.

1 (f) The travel is financed entirely by federal or nonstate
2 funds.

3 (2) If out-of-state travel is necessary but does not meet 1 or
4 more of the conditions in subsection (1), the state budget director
5 may grant an exception to allow the travel. Any exceptions granted
6 by the state budget director shall be reported on a monthly basis
7 to the senate and house of representatives standing committees on
8 appropriations.

9 (3) Not later than January 1 of each year, each department
10 shall prepare a travel report listing all travel by classified and
11 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately
12 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with
13 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be
14 submitted to the senate and house of representatives standing
15 committees on appropriations, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
16 and the state budget director. The report shall include the
17 following information:

18 (a) The name of each person receiving reimbursement for travel
19 outside this state or whose travel costs were paid by this state.

20 (b) The destination of each travel occurrence.

21 (c) The dates of each travel occurrence.

22 (d) A brief statement of the reason for each travel
23 occurrence.

24 (e) The transportation and related costs of each travel
25 occurrence, including the proportion funded with state general

1 fund/general purpose revenues, the proportion funded with state
2 restricted revenues, the proportion funded with federal revenues,
3 and the proportion funded with other revenues.

4 (f) A total of all out-of-state travel funded for the
5 immediately preceding fiscal year.

6 Sec. 234. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used by a
7 principal executive department, state agency, or authority to hire
8 a person to provide legal services that are the responsibility of
9 the attorney general. This prohibition does not apply to legal
10 services for bonding activities and for those activities that the
11 attorney general authorizes.

13 **INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

14 Sec. 301. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer
15 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of
16 the service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN system.

17 Sec. 302. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
18 information technology, departments and agencies shall pay user
19 fees to the department of information technology for technology-
20 related services and projects. Such user fees shall be subject to
21 provisions of an interagency agreement between the departments and
22 agencies and the department of information technology.

23 Sec. 303. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information
24 technology may be designated as work projects and carried forward
25 to support technology projects under the direction of the

1 department of information technology. Funds designated in this
2 manner are not available for expenditure until approved as work
3 projects under section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984
4 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a.

6 **HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING**

7 Sec. 401. On a quarterly basis, the department shall report to
8 the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state police
9 and military affairs on the status of assessments collected and
10 authorized under section 629e of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
11 300, MCL 257.629e, for the purposes of supporting the secondary
12 road patrol grant program. Each quarterly report shall contain
13 updated information on collection levels, revised projected grant
14 allotments to counties for the year, a comparison of projected
15 collections and grant distribution levels with the funds
16 appropriated in part 1 for the secondary road patrol program, and
17 the extent collection levels have exceeded or failed to meet
18 appropriated levels for the preceding fiscal year or expenditure
19 levels from the previous fiscal year.

21 **FORENSIC SCIENCES**

22 Sec. 501. When changes are made to the department's protocol
23 for retaining and purging DNA analysis samples and records, the
24 department shall provide an updated copy to every police agency in
25 the state.

MICHIGAN COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS

Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the MCOLES for maintenance and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the MCOLES.

Sec. 604. From the funds appropriated in part 1 to the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards funds may be used to provide training for motor carrier officers and capitol security officers for the purpose of qualifying them for MCOLES certification.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims a state of emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33, or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401 to 30.421. The state director of emergency management may expend the amounts the director considers necessary to accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to the state budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all

1 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall
2 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that
3 is not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director
4 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the
5 legislature in regard to any possible need for a supplemental
6 appropriation.

7 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the
8 department may receive and expend money from local, private,
9 federal, or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency
10 management training to local or private interests and for the
11 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery,
12 and mitigation activity. If additional expenditure authorization in
13 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the
14 state budget office under this section, the department and the
15 state budget office shall notify the house and senate
16 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
17 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10
18 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount
19 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its
20 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the
21 authorization.

23 **POST UNIFORM SERVICES**

24 Sec. 901. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to
25 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan

1 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited
2 from responding to crimes in progress or other emergency
3 situations, and are responsible for protecting every citizen of
4 this state from harm.

5

6 **STATEWIDE FIELD OPERATIONS**

7 Sec. 1002. Money privately donated to the department is
8 appropriated under part 1 to be used for the purposes designated by
9 the donor of the money. Money privately donated to the department's
10 canine unit shall be used to purchase equipment and other items to
11 enhance the operation of the canine unit.
