**SUBJECT:** Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) 2.0 Deployment Schedule

**CEPI is pleased to announce that MSDS 2.0 is scheduled for deployment September 18, 2009.**

**Collections Available with 2.0 Deployment**

MSDS authorized users can begin working with the following collections, including adding, modifying and removing student records in preparation for upcoming collections.

- 1. Fall 2009 General Collection**
- 2. Request for UIC 2009-2010**
- 3. Student Record Maintenance 2009-2010**
- 4. Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility 2009-2010**
- 5. Early Roster 2009-2010**
- 6. Early Childhood 2009-2010**

**Scheduled Deployment Timeline**

- 1. August 28:** Last day of district-level testing so final testing at the state level can commence and conversion preparations can begin.
- 2. September 9-10:** Student history data-conversion occurs, in which all historical full-time equivalency (FTE) and Single Record Student Database (SRSD) records will be converted.
- 3. September 14-15:** All remaining data conversion, including MSDS 1.0 data, will occur.
- 4. September 16-17:** Final production validation tests run at the state level.
- 5. September 12-17:** The SRSD and MSDS 1.0 will be available in a read-only mode. Authorized users can continue to perform student searches and review reports in the MSDS while it is in the read-only capacity, and anyone can continue to view FTE reports in the SRSD.
- 6. September 18:** MSDS 2.0 goes live. SRSD shuts down.

An update on MSDS 2.0 will be forthcoming that will provide additional detail on functionality to be deployed. Thank you for your support as we continue this transition.
