PART 55, AIR POLLUTION CONTROL, NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT, 1994 PA 451, AS AMENDED. On May 28, 2009, the department's proposed amendments to the Air Pollution Control Rules (SOAHR 2007-038EQ) were filed with the Secretary of State and became effective immediately. The amendments to Part 8, Emission Limitations and Prohibitions—Oxides of Nitrogen (NOx); R 336.1801, R 336.1802a, R 336.1803, R 336.1821, R 336.1822, R 336.1823, R 336.1830, R 336.1831, R 336.1832, and R 336.1833 were needed to meet requirements of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Clean Air Interstate Rule to reduce transported emissions of NOx from electric generating units and large non-electric generating units. Pursuant to Part 301, Inland Lakes and Streams; and Part 303, Wetlands Protection; of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended, the MDEQ's Land and Water Management Division is proposing to issue a new General Permit (GP) to encourage the use of bioengineering practices to stabilize the shorelines of inland lakes. These practices -- also known as "soft" or "green" engineering -- are intended to prevent or control soil erosion and to restore native shorelines while protecting and enhancing fish and wildlife habitat and other natural features associated with the lake. Bioengineering uses a combination of native plantings and biodegradable materials to engineer shoreline protection that, to the extent possible, mimics or enhances the natural shoreline. If this GP is approved, then the DEQ may review and authorize specific bioengineering projects under this GP in an accelerated manner without issuance of any additional public notice.
