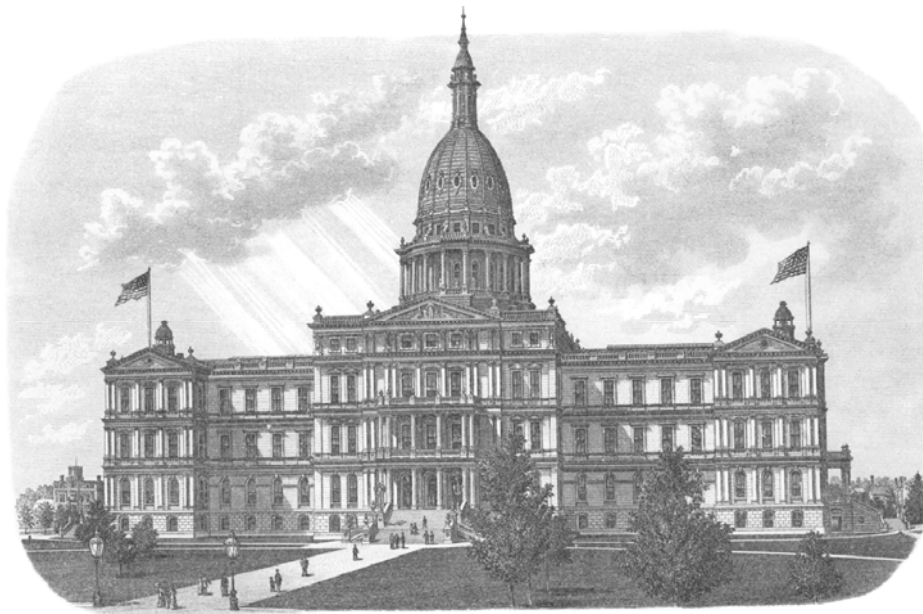

Michigan State Capitol:

This image, with flags flying to indicate that both chambers of the legislature are in session, may have originated as an etching based on a drawing or a photograph. The artist is unknown. The drawing predates the placement of the statue of Austin T. Blair on the capitol grounds in 1898.

PAGE GRAPHICS

Capitol Dome:

The architectural rendering of the Michigan State Capitol's dome is the work of Elijah E. Myers, the building's renowned architect. Myers inked the rendering on linen in late 1871 or early 1872. Myers' fine draftsmanship, the hallmark of his work, is clearly evident.

Because of their size, few architectural renderings of the 19th century have survived. Michigan is fortunate that many of Myers' designs for the Capitol were found in the building's attic in the 1950's. As part of the state's 1987 sesquicentennial celebration, they were conserved and deposited in the Michigan State Archives.

East Elevation of the Michigan State Capitol:

When Myers' drawings were discovered in the 1950's, this view of the Capitol – the one most familiar to Michigan citizens – was missing. During the building's recent restoration (1989-1992), this drawing was commissioned to recreate the architect's original rendering of the east (front) elevation.

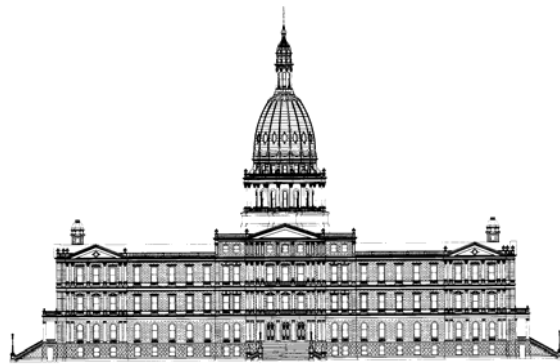

PREFACE

PUBLICATION AND CONTENTS OF THE MICHIGAN REGISTER

The State Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules publishes the *Michigan Register*.

While several statutory provisions address the publication and contents of the *Michigan Register*, two are of particular importance.

24.208 Michigan register; publication; cumulative index; contents; public subscription; fee; synopsis of proposed rule or guideline; transmitting copies to office of regulatory reform.

Sec. 8.

(1) The office of regulatory reform shall publish the Michigan register at least once each month. The Michigan register shall contain all of the following:

- (a) Executive orders and executive reorganization orders.
- (b) On a cumulative basis, the numbers and subject matter of the enrolled senate and house bills signed into law by the governor during the calendar year and the corresponding public act numbers.
- (c) On a cumulative basis, the numbers and subject matter of the enrolled senate and house bills vetoed by the governor during the calendar year.
- (d) Proposed administrative rules.
- (e) Notices of public hearings on proposed administrative rules.
- (f) Administrative rules filed with the secretary of state.
- (g) Emergency rules filed with the secretary of state.
- (h) Notice of proposed and adopted agency guidelines.
- (i) Other official information considered necessary or appropriate by the office of regulatory reform.
- (j) Attorney general opinions.
- (k) All of the items listed in section 7(m) after final approval by the certificate of need commission under section 22215 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.22215.

(2) The office of regulatory reform shall publish a cumulative index for the Michigan register.

(3) The Michigan register shall be available for public subscription at a fee reasonably calculated to cover publication and distribution costs.

(4) If publication of an agency's proposed rule or guideline or an item described in subsection (1)(k) would be unreasonably expensive or lengthy, the office of regulatory reform may publish a brief synopsis of the proposed rule or guideline or item described in subsection (1)(k), including information on how to obtain a complete copy of the proposed rule or guideline or item described in subsection (1)(k) from the agency at no cost.

(5) An agency shall electronically transmit a copy of the proposed rules and notice of public hearing to the office of regulatory reform for publication in the Michigan register.

4.1203 Michigan register fund; creation; administration; expenditures; disposition of money received from sale of Michigan register and amounts paid by state agencies; use of fund; price of Michigan register; availability of text on internet; copyright or other proprietary interest; fee prohibited; definition.

Sec. 203.

- (1) The Michigan register fund is created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the office of regulatory reform. The fund shall be expended only as provided in this section.
- (2) The money received from the sale of the Michigan register, along with those amounts paid by state agencies pursuant to section 57 of the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.257, shall be deposited with the state treasurer and credited to the Michigan register fund.
- (3) The Michigan register fund shall be used to pay the costs of preparing, printing, and distributing the Michigan register.
- (4) The department of management and budget shall sell copies of the Michigan register at a price determined by the office of regulatory reform not to exceed the cost of preparation, printing, and distribution.
- (5) Notwithstanding section 204, beginning January 1, 2001, the office of regulatory reform shall make the text of the Michigan register available to the public on the internet.
- (6) The information described in subsection (5) that is maintained by the office of regulatory reform shall be made available in the shortest feasible time after the information is available. The information described in subsection (5) that is not maintained by the office of regulatory reform shall be made available in the shortest feasible time after it is made available to the office of regulatory reform.
- (7) Subsection (5) does not alter or relinquish any copyright or other proprietary interest or entitlement of this state relating to any of the information made available under subsection (5).
- (8) The office of regulatory reform shall not charge a fee for providing the Michigan register on the internet as provided in subsection (5).
- (9) As used in this section, "Michigan register" means that term as defined in section 5 of the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.205.

CITATION TO THE MICHIGAN REGISTER

The *Michigan Register* is cited by year and issue number. For example, 2001 MR 1 refers to the year of issue (2001) and the issue number (1).

CLOSING DATES AND PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

The deadlines for submitting documents to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules for publication in the *Michigan Register* are the first and fifteenth days of each calendar month, unless the submission day falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, in which event the deadline is extended to include the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. Documents filed or received after 5:00 p.m. on the closing date of a filing period will appear in the succeeding issue of the *Michigan Register*.

The State Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules is not responsible for the editing and proofreading of documents submitted for publication.

RELATIONSHIP TO THE MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The *Michigan Administrative Code* (1979 edition), which contains all permanent administrative rules in effect as of December 1979, was, during the period 1980-83, updated each calendar quarter with the publication of a paperback supplement. An annual supplement contained those permanent rules, which had appeared in the 4 quarterly supplements covering that year.

Quarterly supplements to the Code were discontinued in January 1984, and replaced by the monthly publication of permanent rules and emergency rules in the *Michigan Register*. Annual supplements have included the full text of those permanent rules that appear in the twelve monthly issues of the *Register* during a given calendar year. Emergency rules published in an issue of the *Register* are noted in the annual supplement to the Code.

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**PROPOSED ADMINISTRATIVE RULES,
NOTICES OF PUBLIC HEARINGS**

MCL 24.242(3) states in part:

“... the agency shall submit a copy of the notice of public hearing to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules for publication in the Michigan register. An agency's notice shall be published in the Michigan register before the public hearing and the agency shall file a copy of the notice of public hearing with the State Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules.”

MCL 24.208 states in part:

“Sec. 8. (1) The State Office of Administrative Hearings and Rules shall publish the Michigan register at least once each month. The Michigan register shall contain all of the following:

* * *

(d) Proposed administrative rules.

(e) Notices of public hearings on proposed administrative rules.”

ACUPUNCTURE - GENERAL RULES

Filed with the Secretary of State on

These rules become effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State unless adopted under sections 33, 44, or 45a(6) of 1969 PA 306. Rules adopted under these sections become effective 7 days after filing with the Secretary of State.

(By authority conferred on the director of the department of community health by section 18709 of 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.18709 and Executive Reorganization Order Nos. 1996-1, 1996-2 and 2003-1, MCL 330.3101, 445.2001 and 445.2011)

Draft March 20, 2009

R 338.13001, R 338.13005, R 338.13010, R 338.13015, R 338.13020, R 338.13025, R 338.13030, R 338.13035, R 338.13040, and R 338.13045 are added to the Michigan Administrative Code.

R 338.13001 Definitions.

Rule 1. As used in these rules:

- (a) "Board" means the board of acupuncture.
- (b) "Code" means 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.1101.
- (c) "Department" means the department of community health.
- (d) "Endorsement" means the acknowledgement that the licensing criteria in 1 jurisdiction are substantially equivalent to the criteria established and described in section 16186 of the code.

R 338.13005 Application for acupuncturist registration; requirements.

Rule 5. An applicant for registration as an acupuncturist, in addition to meeting the requirements of the code and these rules, shall comply with all of the following provisions:

- (a) Submit a completed application on a form provided by the department, together with the requisite fee.
- (b) Possess a current certification that was conferred by the national certification commission for acupuncture and oriental medicine (nccaom).

R 338.13010 Registration by endorsement; acupuncturist.

Rule 10. (1) An applicant for an acupuncturist registration by endorsement shall submit a completed application on a form provided by the department, together with the requisite fee. An applicant shall meet the requirements of the code and these rules.

(2) If an applicant was registered or licensed as an acupuncturist in another state where the requirements for registration or licensure were substantially equivalent to the requirements specified in

the code and these rules, has held a valid registration or license in that state immediately preceding the date of filing an application for a Michigan registration, and provides documentation that he or she is currently certified in acupuncture or oriental medicine by nccaom, then it is presumed that the applicant meets the requirements of R 338.13005.

(3) If an applicant does not meet the requirements of this rule, then the applicant shall comply with the requirements in R 338.13015.

(4) To determine substantially equivalent as specified in subrule (2) of this rule, an applicant may be required to submit, or cause to be submitted, all of the following materials:

(a) A copy of the certification criteria, including but not limited to, educational and experiential requirements.

(b) A copy of the examination booklet or a description of the content of the examination and examination scores, as issued by the certifying or testing agency.

(c) An affidavit from the appropriate certifying body or testing agency that describes the certification examination at the time that the examination was administered.

(d) An affidavit from either the appropriate state licensing or registration board or a licensing or registration examination agency that describes the examination and the legal standards that had been in effect at the time of licensure.

R 338.13015 Applicants with nonaccredited training; registration requirements.

Rule 15. (1) If an applicant completed an educational program that does not meet the standards as adopted by reference in R 338.13030, then the applicant shall comply with all of the following provisions in addition to meeting the requirements of the code:

(a) Submit a completed application on a form provided by the department, together with the requisite fee.

(b) Provide documentation to verify his or her education and training.

(c) Have his or her educational program evaluated by an agency approved by the department to determine if it is equivalent to the program standards that are adopted by reference in R 338.13030.

(d) Provide documentation that he or she possesses a current certification in acupuncture or oriental medicine by the nccaom or other entity that is substantially equivalent to the certification by nccaom.

(e) Demonstrate a working knowledge of the English language, if an applicant's educational program was taught in a language other than English. To demonstrate a working knowledge of the English language, an applicant shall establish either of the following:

(i) That he or she has obtained a score of not less than 550 on the test of English as a foreign language (toefl) administered by the educational testing service and obtained a score of not less than 50 on the test of spoken English administered by the educational testing service.

(ii) That he or she has obtained a score of not less than 89 on the test of English as a foreign language internet-based test (toefl ibt) administered by the educational testing service.

(2) To determine substantially equivalent as specified in subrule (1)(d) of this rule, an applicant may be required to submit, or cause to be submitted, all of the following materials:

(a) A copy of the certification criteria, including but not limited to, educational and experiential requirements.

(b) A copy of the examination booklet or a description of the content of the examination and examination scores, as issued by the certifying or testing agency.

(c) An affidavit from the appropriate certifying body or testing agency that describes the certification examination at the time that the examination was administered.

(d) An affidavit from either the appropriate state licensing or registration board or a licensing or registration examination agency that describes the examination and the legal standards that had been in effect at the time of licensure.

R 338.13020 Renewal of registration; continuing education requirements.

Rule 20. (1) An applicant for renewal of a registration who has been registered for the 2-year period immediately preceding the expiration date of the registration shall maintain certification that was conferred by nccaom during the 2 years preceding an application for renewal.

(2) Submission of an application for renewal shall constitute the applicant's certification of compliance with this rule. An applicant for renewal shall retain documentation of meeting the requirements of this rule for a period of 3 years from the date of applying for renewal of a registration. Failure to comply with this rule shall be a violation of section 16221(h) of the code.

R 338.13025 Application for acupuncturist re-registration; requirements.

Rule 25. An applicant for re-registration as an acupuncturist whose registration has expired may be re-registered, as provided under section 16201 of the code, upon submission of a completed application form provided by the department with the requisite fee and upon satisfying both of the following requirements:

(a) Being verified, on a form supplied by the department, by the registration agency of any state or territory of the United States in which the applicant holds a current registration or ever held a registration as an acupuncturist, which includes, but is not limited to, showing proof of any disciplinary action taken or pending disciplinary action imposed upon the applicant.

(b) Possessing a current certification that was conferred by nccaom.

R 338.13030 Educational program standards; adoption by reference.

Rule 30. The board approves and adopts by reference in these rules the standards for accrediting programs in acupuncture and oriental medicine adopted by the accreditation commission for acupuncture and oriental medicine (acaom), which are set forth in the publication entitled "ACAOM Accreditation Manual," July 2008. Copies of these standards may be obtained at no cost from the commission's website at www.acaom.org. Copies are available for inspection and distribution at cost from the Michigan Board of Acupuncture, Bureau of Health Professions, Department of Community Health, P.O. Box 30670, Lansing, MI 48909. A master's level program in acupuncture and oriental medicine that is accredited by the accreditation commission for acupuncture and oriental medicine is an educational program that is acceptable to the board.

R 338.13035 Delegation; supervision.

Rule 35. (1) An acupuncturist shall practice under the delegation of an allopathic physician or osteopathic physician in accordance with section 16215(3) of the code.

(2) An acupuncturist shall be supervised by a delegating physician, who shall comply with all of the following provisions of supervision:

(a) Have continuous availability of direct communication with the acupuncturist either in person or by radio, telephone, or telecommunication.

(b) Meet with the acupuncturist on a regularly scheduled basis for consultation and practice review, review of records, and education regarding the performance of functions within the scope of acupuncture.

(c) Establish predetermined procedures or protocols in conjunction with the acupuncturist.

R 338.13040 Patient records; retention; disposition; confidentiality.

Rule 40. (1) In accordance with section 16213 of the code, any individual covered by these rules shall be required to retain a patient record for the following time periods:

At least 7 years from the date of the last acupuncture service.

(b) For a minor client, at least 7 years from the date of the last acupuncture service, or until the minor client reaches the age of 19, whichever is later.

(2) Any individual covered by these rules shall store and dispose of written, electronic, and other client records so as to ensure their confidentiality, except as otherwise proscribed by law.

R 338.13045 Prohibited conduct.

Rule 45. Prohibited conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following acts or omissions by any individual covered by these rules:

(a) Refusing to provide professional service to a person because of the person's race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex, sexual orientation, or disability.

(b) Being involved in a situation that creates a conflict of interest that interferes with the exercise of professional discretion or makes a patient's interests secondary.

(c) Being involved in or soliciting a sexual relationship with a current patient or a member or members of the current patient's immediate family.

The Department of Community Health will hold a public hearing on Monday, November 9, 2009, at 9 a.m. at the Department of Community Health, Ottawa Building, 611 West Ottawa, Conference Room 3, Upper Level, Lansing, Michigan.

The public hearing is being held to receive comments from interested persons on establishing in administrative rules requirements for registration as an acupuncturist, pursuant to Public Act 30 of 2006, which amended the Public Health Code to provide for the registration of acupuncturists and to regulate the practice of acupuncture. The proposed rules will specify that an acupuncturist will have to practice under the delegation of an allopathic or osteopathic physician, in accordance with Section 16215 of the Code, and will establish requirements for obtaining this supervision. In addition, the proposed rules will require an acupuncturist to maintain patient records, in accordance with Section 16213 of the Code, and will specify acts or omissions by an acupuncturist that will be considered prohibited conduct.

These rules are being promulgated under the authority of sections of 16145 and 16501 et seq. of 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16145 and MCL 333.16501 et seq. and Executive Reorganization Order Nos. 1996-1, 1996-2 and 2003-18, MCL 330.3101, 445.2001 and 445.2011. The rules will take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State, unless specified otherwise in the rules.

EXECUTIVE ORDERS

EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 2009 – 44
ABOLISHING THE MICHIGAN CLIMATE ACTION COUNCIL
ABOLISHING THE AQUATIC NUISANCE SPECIES COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Section 1 of Article V of the Michigan Constitution of 1963 vests the executive power of the State of Michigan in the Governor;

WHEREAS, the Michigan Climate Action Council has completed the work for which it was created;

WHEREAS, abolishing the Aquatic Nuisance Species Council will contribute to a smaller and more efficient state government;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jennifer M. Granholm, Governor of the State of Michigan, by virtue of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and Michigan law, order the following:

- A. The Michigan Climate Action Council created within the Department of Environmental Quality by Executive Order 2007-42 is abolished.
- B. The Aquatic Nuisance Species Council created within the Office of Great Lakes by Executive Order 2002-21 is abolished.

The provisions of this Order are effective upon filing.

**ADMINISTRATIVE RULES
ENROLLED SENATE AND HOUSE BILLS
SIGNED INTO LAW OR VETOED
(2009 SESSION)**

Mich. Const. Art. IV, §33 provides: “Every bill passed by the legislature shall be presented to the governor before it becomes law, and the governor shall have 14 days measured in hours and minutes from the time of presentation in which to consider it. If he approves, he shall within that time sign and file it with the secretary of state and it shall become law . . . If he does not approve, and the legislature has within that time finally adjourned the session at which the bill was passed, it shall not become law. If he disapproves . . . he shall return it within such 14-day period with his objections, to the house in which it originated.”

Mich. Const. Art. IV, §27, further provides: “No act shall take effect until the expiration of 90 days from the end of the session at which it was passed, but the legislature may give immediate effect to acts by a two-thirds vote of the members elected to and serving in each house.”

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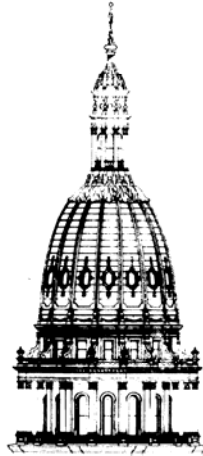
