Resolution Honoring Edward Rivet

Bach read the Resolution honoring Rivet and signed same. The Resolution will be framed and sent to Rivet with a letter thanking him for his service.

Department Update

Ramsdell directed the Board to the Legislative Update memo and verbally reviewed same.

Ramsdell indicated that the NABP annual meeting is scheduled for May 16, 2009 thru May 19, 2009 in Miami and asked if any members wished to attend. Farida expressed a willingness to attend, and Collins stated that she would be an alternate. Ramsdell will check with the NABP regarding funding options.

With regard to the Michigan Medical Marihuana Program, Ramsdell clarified that medical marihuana cannot be obtained via prescription. She briefly explained the patient and caregiver responsibilities and stated that the program will begin no later than April 4, 2009. Ramsdell answered various questions and discussion was held.

Timothy James Dempsey, R.Ph. – Proposal for Decision

MOTION by Farida, seconded by Schmidt, to accept the Proposal for Decision and reinstate Petitioner's pharmacy and controlled substance licenses in the matter of Timothy James Dempsey, R.Ph.

MOTION PREVAILED

MOTION by Farida, seconded by Schmidt, to place Petitioner on probation for a minimum of two years in the matter of Timothy James Dempsey, R.Ph. Additionally, Petitioner's license shall be limited for one (1) year. For the first six (6) months of the limitation, Petitioner must practice a minimum of 1,000 hours under direct on-site supervision by a board-approved supervisor and must pass the MPJE. During the last six (6) months of limitation, Petitioner must complete a minimum of 1,000 hours of practice under general supervision by a board-approved supervisor. Petitioner must also notify the Department if there is a change in his employer. This limitation will run concurrent with probation, and quarterly supervisor and employer reports shall be submitted to the Department. Upon successful completion of practice under limitation, Petitioner's licenses will be automatically reclassified to full licensure status. Petitioner must also continue to comply with the disciplinary HPRP agreement in which he is currently enrolled.

MOTION by Farida, seconded by Collins, to accept the Proposal for Decision, with correction to the last sentence of the first paragraph of page 15 of the Proposal for Decision noting the correct gender and profession, and grant reinstatement in the matter of Jean Marie Hitchens, R.Ph.

MOTION by Farida, seconded by Collins, to place Petitioner on probation for a minimum of one (1) year in the matter of Jean Marie Hitchens, R.Ph. Additionally, Petitioner's license shall be limited for one (1) year. For the first six (6) months of the limitation, Petitioner must practice a minimum of 1,000 hours under direct on-site supervision by a board-approved supervisor and must pass the MPJE. During the last six (6) months of limitation, Petitioner must complete a minimum of 1,000 hours of practice under general supervision by a board-approved supervisor. This limitation will run concurrent with probation. Petitioner shall provide quarterly supervisor reports to the Department and shall complete five (5) live continuing education credits in the area of ethics. Petitioner's controlled substance license may be reinstated upon completion of licensure application and submitting applicable fees.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Karen Jonas of the Michigan Pharmacy Association indicated that live continuing education credits in the area of ethics are very difficult to find. She suggested the Board consider other types of ethics continuing education in the future. Jonas also indicated that the Ohio Board of Pharmacy has created an electronic prescribing error data base and would like to see Michigan have a similar reporting mechanism. Lastly, she indicated that the tamper resistant program needs to be addressed.

Mary Thomas brought to the Board's attention the need for additional oversight of pharmacy bags that are distributed to EMT's in her region, that being region 6. She indicated that there have been instances in which recalled medications are being administered to patients. She also complimented Mike Wissel for the help he has given her in the past on various issues.

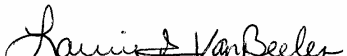
