



## Michigan Work-Study Fact Sheet



### Description

The Michigan Work-Study Program provides work opportunities to help needy students pay educational expenses. Qualifying students must enroll at a participating public or independent Michigan college or university on at least a half-time basis. Michigan Work-Study jobs are usually on campus, but many colleges have agreements with off-campus employers. The rate of pay will be at least the current Federal minimum wage.

### Application

Colleges award the funds. Qualifying students apply for this need-based aid by submitting a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). When funds are insufficient to meet the needs of all eligible applicants, colleges will target available funds to students with the greatest need.

### Program Limits

The award amount varies and is based on need, hours worked, and wage paid. Awards are determined by the college financial aid office and are typically packaged with other types of assistance. The campus award letter, sent by the college, is the means by which students are notified regarding Michigan Work-Study eligibility.

### Eligibility

- Demonstrate financial need.
- Enroll at least half time in an eligible undergraduate/graduate program at an approved Michigan community college, public university or independent, degree-granting college or university.
- Be a Michigan resident for one year prior to program application.
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- Not be incarcerated.
- For renewal, meet institution's satisfactory academic progress (SAP) policy.
