

Initiatives

	Commission, other state attorneys general, stakeholders including senior advocates, the Better Business Bureau, and the telecomunications industry to crackdown on illegal robocalls;
	Roll out a new website to educate the public about illegal robocalls, to give the public better ways to protect themselves, and to keep the public informed about new updates and initiatives;
	Introduce a "scam tracker" so concerned residents can learn about current or past robocall-related scams;
	Launch a statewide speaking tour to inform the public about the problem and our crackdown to stop it
	Suggest proposed rules to federal agencies to help stop illegal robocalls and related problems;
	Work with carriers to establish "Do Not Originate" lists that would prevent robocallers from spoofing their calls using Michigan government numbers;
	Work with the Michigan legislature to provide the necessary tools to properly enforce against illegal robocallers.
	Major changes to our laws would include:
	 Eliminating problems in the definitions of robocalls and related terms;
	 Updating the statutes to match current and future technological capabilities of robocallers;
	 Closing loopholes like immunity for solicitors representing sham charities and scammers arranging face-to-face visits;
	 Providing the Department of Attorney General with necessary investigative and enforcement powers; and Increasing penalties for illegal robocalls.
	Develop new legal theories to target and hold accountable all bad actors in an illegal robocall;
	Enforcement against Michigan-based illegal robocallers; and
	Expand real time manitering and enforcement capabilities to step rehocall campaigns in their tracks
