**Policy Summary:** Beneficiaries cannot be charged for the use of nitrous oxide or local anesthesia, as the cost is included in the reimbursement of the dental procedure performed.

**Purpose:** To provide clarification of the current dental anesthesia policy related to the use of nitrous oxide-oxygen sedation and locally administered anesthetics.

The purpose of this bulletin is to clarify the intent of current policy and coverage of anesthesia services provided to Medicaid beneficiaries by a dentist. Nitrous oxide-oxygen sedation is covered for Medicaid beneficiaries of all ages. Reimbursement for nitrous oxide-oxygen sedation is included in the cost of providing the dental procedure performed. Nitrous oxide and locally administered anesthetics have associated procedure codes published by the American Dental Association (ADA) in the Code on Dental Procedures and Nomenclature (CDT) manual; however, Medicaid does not separately reimburse for these procedures. A dentist that accepts a patient as a Medicaid beneficiary cannot bill the beneficiary for nitrous oxide or locally administered anesthetics. In addition, the beneficiary cannot be billed for the difference between the dentist's charge and the Medicaid payment for covered services.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) aligns with the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) recommendations for the use of nitrous oxide-oxygen sedation. The use of nitrous oxide-oxygen sedation is indicated for, but not limited to, a dental patient for whom profound local anesthesia cannot be obtained, or a patient who is fearful, and/or has special health care needs. The ADA considers conscious sedation using nitrous oxide-oxygen to be a safe and effective method to produce analgesia and reduce anxiety in dentistry when used appropriately. Administering nitrous oxide-oxygen entails a minimal risk to patients, but dentists should be aware of contraindications for use and consult relevant medical specialists for patients with significant underlying medical conditions. Dentists should always follow evidence-based clinical best practices and the ADA's Principles of Ethics and Code of Professional Conduct, which can be accessed on the ADA website at <a href="https://www.ada.org">www.ada.org</a> >> Publications >> Ethics and Professional Conduct.
