



On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit Application (LCC-209)



Before you submit an application for an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit to the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, you must ensure that the swimming pool for which you are applying for the permit meets the requirements of the Public Health Code, MCL 333.12526a. Contact the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, & Energy (EGLE) to submit a Permit for Construction or Modification of a Public Swimming Pool to construct a new swimming pool or modify an existing swimming pool to conform to the Public Health Code requirements for food and alcohol service in swimming pools.

The Michigan Liquor Control Commission cannot advise liquor licensees on the specific requirements for Public Swimming Pool Licenses under the Public Health Code.

On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit Requirements Pursuant to MCL 436.1548 & MCL 333.12526a

1. An On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit may be issued to an on-premises liquor licensee that has been issued a Public Swimming Pool License from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, & Energy (EGLE). The Commission will conduct an on-site investigation as part of a licensee's application for an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit.
2. An On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit costs \$350.00 for the initial fee, along with a \$70.00 inspection fee. The annual renewal fee is \$350.00.
3. The sale and service of alcoholic liquor conducted under an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit must be within an exclusive area that is well-defined and clearly marked. A bouy line may be used to delineate the exclusive area. The exclusive area must not be accessible by patrons under the age of 21. An individual who purchased alcoholic liquor in the exclusive area may possess alcoholic liquor sold by the licensee in the exclusive area and the licensed premises adjacent to the exclusive area.
4. The exclusive area covered by an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit must be part of the licensed premises. If the exclusive area is not currently part of the licensed premises, either inside a licensed building or outside in an approved Outdoor Service Area, then the licensee must submit a separate application to add space to the licensed premises for an indoor swimming pool or a separate application for new Outdoor Service approval.
5. If the licensee holds a Class C or B-Hotel license and has a separate bar in the exclusive area covered by an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit, whether the bar is outside the pool or is a swim-up bar in the pool, the licensee will need an approved Additional Bar for each bar within the exclusive area. Additional Bars cost \$350.00 and are renewable annually.
6. All sales and service of alcoholic liquor in the exclusive area covered by an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit must be conducted by an employee of the licensee that has successfully completed a server training program approved by the Commission.
7. Lifeguard service must be provided in the swimming pool enclosure* when the swimming pool is open for use.

8. The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, & Energy (EGLE) has determined under section 12526 that the plans and specifications for the swimming pool meet all of the following requirements:

- a. The materials used to construct the area within the swimming pool water that is used for serving, preparing, or consuming food or beverages are made of a material that is nonabsorbent, is easily cleanable, and can be regularly sanitized.
- b. The area within the swimming pool water that is used for serving, preparing, or consuming food or beverages is constructed in a manner that has no sharp edges, has no open cracks, and has sealed joints.
- c. Areas within the swimming pool water where there is ice, food, equipment, and any other item that is stored or used in the preparation of food or beverages are physically separated by a service counter or other structure or material in a manner that protects the ice, food, equipment, or other item from splash or spillage of swimming pool water.
- d. The swimming pool water is equipped with heightened disinfection and filtration standards** and maintains increased disinfectant residuals.
- e. The swimming pool water is monitored with an electronic chemical control monitoring system.

9. The water temperature of the swimming pool is maintained at 104 degrees Fahrenheit or less.

10. The free disinfectant residual levels in the swimming pool water are tested poolside at least 4 times per day when the public swimming pool is open for use.

11. An individual who holds a certification as a certified pool operator, or an equivalent certification as determined by EGLE must be readily available when the swimming pool is open for use to test the swimming pool water and to operate the water treatment equipment of the swimming pool.

12. The swimming pool must not contain a slide, diving board, starting block, spray feature, or similar addition in the area of the swimming pool permitted for the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor. However, the swimming pool may have a waterfall, or another decorative feature, that is not intended for interaction or contact with an individual using the public swimming pool in the area of the public swimming pool permitted for the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor.

13. A person engaged in the operation of a swimming pool that allows for the consumption of food or beverages in the swimming pool under an On-Premises Public Swimming Pool Permit must ensure that food and beverages are served in a container made of plastic or another nonbreakable material and that is designed to reduce the chances of spilling the food or beverage in the swimming pool water.

* "Swimming pool enclosure" means the area containing 1 public swimming pool or, if the area contains 2 or more public swimming pools, the area containing all of the public swimming pools, which area is surrounded by an uninterrupted constructed feature or obstacle that meets all of the following requirements:

- a. It is used to surround and secure the area.
- b. It is intended to deter or effectively prevent unpermitted, uncontrolled, and unfettered access to the area.
- c. It is designed to resist climbing and to prevent passage through and under it.

** "Heightened disinfection and filtration standards" means all of the following:

- a. A regenerative media filter system or an equivalent filter system. If the swimming pool uses a sand-type filter or a cartridge-type filter, a filter system is considered equivalent under this subparagraph if it requires a reduction in the max flow rate per square foot of filter area
- b. An accelerated water turnover rate of once every 4 hours or less when the public swimming pool is open for use.
- c. An ultraviolet light secondary disinfection system or an equivalent secondary disinfection system.
- d. Increased inlets to prevent impaired circulation and to increase water circulation due to potential obstructions.
- e. Increased number of skimmers or surge weirs to ensure effective surface water skimming.

The licensee must obtain all other required state and local licenses, permits, and approvals for this business before using this license for the sale of alcoholic liquor on the licensed premises.
