- Accepted over 207,000 Michiganders who have taken the first step toward earning a tuition-free degree or credential through Michigan Reconnect.
- Awarded 242 scholarships for students and graduates as part of the Michigander Scholars Program which provides qualifying tech and engineering undergraduate and graduate students with unprecedented career access and up to a \$10,000 scholarship.

PILLAR 2: INCREASE OPPORTUNITIES THAT GROW THE MIDDLE CLASS

Michigan's workforce system is #1 in the nation for highest earnings in the country for individuals with disabilities.

Michigan's workforce system is #3 in the nation in helping adults get employed.

- Awarded \$60.5M to businesses across the state through the Going PRO Talent Fund which supported the training of over 32,000 workers who saw an average wage increase of 7.2%.
- **Connected 17,562 homes** to high-speed Internet across the state.
- Supported the construction or rehabilitation of nearly 20,000 housing units across the state.
- Enrolled more than 59,000 students in PreK for All programs, saving families an estimated \$10,000/year in childcare costs.

PILLAR 3: SUPPORT BUSINESS GROWTH & MAKE MICHIGAN A TOP 10 STATE FOR LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION

Michigan's workforce system is #1 in the nation for helping individuals with disabilities get employed.

- Established a \$60M Innovation Fund aimed at providing early-stage capital to startups.
- Provided STEAM Ahead funding to over 200 companies of all sizes to hire 1,195 interns to increase individual opportunities and businesses' competitiveness.
- Connected 1,784 people directly into good-paying, high-tech roles with Michigan employers and trained an additional 1,291 workers through upskilling/reskilling with those employers via targeted Talent Action Teams.
- Served more than 336,000 Michiganders, helping them with career assistance, barrier removal, or entry into the workforce. This is higher than any other state in the Midwest.
- Served 9,563 businesses across the state, helping them recruit talent and increase their competitiveness.
