We are helping kids!

- 100% of schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs are serving free meals to their students
- Over 660 sponsors
- Over 5,000 schools
- Over 1.3 million students have access to meals
- Preliminary data for August 2023 vs August 2022
 - 120,000 more students eating lunch daily
 - 57,000 more students eating breakfast daily







What is Eligible through Michigan School Meals?

- Meals served in public school districts, public school academies and intermediate school districts
- Meals served to students in:
 - Kindergarten to Grade 12
 - Pre-Kindergarten Great Start Readiness Program (GRSP) or tuition-based 4year-old preschool classrooms run by districts
 - Special education programs up to age 26





What is <u>Not</u> Eligible through Michigan School Meals?

- Meals served in nonpublic schools
- Meals served in GSRP or other preschool programs that are part of a Community Based Organization (CBO)
- Meals served to teachers and staff
- Second meals or a la carte items





What are the Michigan School Meals Program Requirements for Participation?

Program requirements include but are not limited to:

- Must participate in both National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program
- Must adopt Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) to maximize federal reimbursement
- Must collect relevant family income information via Education Benefit Forms
- Must write off all outstanding student meal negative balances
- Program participation is optional for sponsors.





What are the Michigan School Meals Program Recommendations for Participation?

- Participating sponsors are encouraged to offer meals that meet students' dietary restrictions, including:
 - The provision of gluten-free meals, vegetarian meals, and vegan meals
 - Upon request, kosher meals and halal meals
 - Meals meeting any allergy restrictions as confirmed by a doctor's note

School day meal service only



National School Lunch, School Breakfast and Preschool Program meal patterns



All claimed meals must be reimbursable – students must still be charged for a la carte and second meals.
