# **ARCHIVES OF MICHIGAN**



Originally laid off in 1843, Ontonagon County was later officially organized in 1848. The county coordinates are Range 38 West through 44 West (38W-44W) and Township 46 North through 51 North (46N-51N). Adjacent counties include Houghton (east), Iron (southeast), and Gogebic (south & west). Lake Superior is on the north border of Ontonagon County.

Original records from Ontonagon County are available at the Archives of Michigan. The list below is organized by record type; each record type lists specific records, the years of coverage and the record group (RG) number assigned to that collection.
