The 128-bed home - opened anew in 2021 - offers every member a private bedroom, private bathroom, and plentiful community space, along with many additional features situated onsite, including a nature trail, cemetery, monuments, fountain, and more.



His face would light up when he'd see the old cars. I just always remember how much joy that brought him. It's the little things that turn into the big things."




MVH PROFILE IN COURAGE: BILL KELLEY, NAVY VETERAN



Bill Kelley is a member at MVH at Grand Rapids. But if you're looking for him, good luck finding him. He stays pretty active at MVH. He could be at an activity on his household, in the community center playing bingo or painting, working out in the therapy department, or out in town for dinner. One never knows.

Bill is a Navy veteran, and at 92 years of age, is proud to still workout and lift weights every day. Decades ago, Bill served on a U.S. Navy destroyer in the Korean conflict. After the war, he worked in steel mills for more than forty years before trying his hand at other endeavors.





On living at Michigan Veteran Homes, Bill said, "There's no better place for a veteran that needs nursing home care. A veteran won't be sorry to put their feet in this place. They'd be very lucky to come here. It's my home, and I'll be here until my last breath. The people here: the nurses, the aides - you name it - and they're the best. There's no doubt about it."

MVH D.J. JACOBETTI

Summary:

Opened in 1981 in the former St. Mary's Hospital, a stone's throw from Lake Superior, MVH D.J. Jacobetti is known across the Upper Peninsula for the provision of compassionate care and exceptional quality of life to U.P. veterans and their loved ones.

What Else?

MVH D.J. Jacobetti was recently funded for replacement, and MVH anticipates breaking ground on the new Home in Marquette Township in summer 2025, after which construction will take approximately 3 years. The new Jacobetti will be a 108-bed private bed/private bath skilled nursing facility for veterans, located on 38+ beautiful acres: a home worthy of those who wore the uniform.

MVH PROFILE IN CARE: TODD MILLER, LPN

The Memory Care Unit at MVH D.J. Jacobetti is a special place with some pretty special people. One of those people is Marine Corps veteran Todd Miller. A Licensed Practical Nurse at Jacobetti, Todd has been caring for veterans there for nearly fifteen years: a veteran, providing care to his fellow veterans. Todd, with humility, credits their team's care to the people he works alongside: "We are a special team, and we think of our veteran members as family members to us, too. Every little thing we can do to make them smile - it makes everyone's day better. It makes their lives better." A special memory among many for Todd is of a specific veteran he cared for who had no real family, and with whom he grew a trusted relationship. "We'd talk daily. When he had his open-heart surgery, he was surprised to see me at the hospital and asked what I was doing there. I told him, 'you're part of our family.' He had a tough exterior, but he shed a tear, and he knew that I cared - that we cared - about him." We're honored to have Todd providing compassionate care to MVH veterans and their loved ones.



MVH PROFILE IN COURAGE: ROSEMARY SUNDBERG, NAVY VETERAN

Rosemarie Sundberg is a proud 3rd generation Navy veteran. At Jacobetti, everyone knows her as "Sunny." Born in Indiana, her family moved north to Michigan's Upper Peninsula when she was six years old. She made the U.P. her home, until she joined the Navy, and served as a hospital corpsman. Following service, she returned to the U.P. and earned her degree from Northern Michigan University. She would go on to work at the Presque Isle Power Plant. In her free time, Sunny always loved enjoying the outdoors.



Since living at MVH D.J. Jacobetti, Sunny's all-time favorite activity has been fishing on Lake Superior during the South Shore Fishing Association's Annual Veterans Fishing Day. On making Jacobetti her home, Sunny said, "It's comfortable to be here. We're treated with respect and compassion - and we have fun!" On her care, Sunny went on to say, "The staff and volunteers are commendable. They know what they're doing, and they take good care of the members."

But war had already arrived in Europe, and lives, like Al's, changed throughout the nation. Al joined the U.S. Army, and served with the 3rd Cavalry in Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes, and Central Europe. Amongst other awards, he earned the Purple Heart in service to our nation. After the war, Al started his own small business that he owned for more than four decades, spent time with his family, and lived life in the free society he stood to defend.





On living at Michigan Veteran Homes, Al said, "Exercise and therapy at the home keeps my legs going. And talking in small groups with other veterans - they can relate to me. We all served for our country. They take care of me here. It's a good place to be." We're proud to care for Al and so many other veterans who've stood to serve our nation.

2024 was a strong year for Michigan Veteran Homes. We continued to provide exceptional care and quality of life to hundreds of veterans and their loved ones, while pursuing our vision for the future. We broke ground on a new maintenance warehouse in Chesterfield Twp, and began construction on an addition to MVH at Grand Rapids. After a setback on the initial planned site for the MVH D.J. Jacobetti replacement, we made progress in securing a beautiful location just a few miles from the current Jacobetti. But this journey - our journey - has been much longer than just one year.

In the past several years, alongside our robust network of allies, supporters, donors, volunteers, and partners, MVH has . . .

- transitioned our governance and oversight structure;
- broken ground on, constructed opened, occupied, and certified (2) new 153,000 sqft. skilled nursing facilities for veterans;
- expanded our geographic footprint by 50%, to a new region (SE MI);
- navigated a pandemic, impacting older and vulnerable adults;
- achieved CMS certification at each of our 3 homes;
- earned 5-star ratings from CMS at each of our 3 homes;
- secured funding to replace MVH D.J. Jacobetti; and
- secured hundreds of millions of federal dollars to support veterans and their loved ones right here in Michigan.
