MPART EXECUTIVE ORDER FISCAL YEAR 2020 FAST FACTS

The Michigan PFAS Action Response Team (MPART) was created as an advisory body within the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy by the Governor's office under Executive Order (EO) 2019-03. The EO established MPART as an enduring body to address the threat of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substance (PFAS) contamination in Michigan, protect public health, and ensure the safety of Michigan's land, air, and water, while facilitating interagency coordination, increasing transparency, and requiring clear standards to ensure accountability. Below are actions taken in fiscal year (FY) 2020.


